

<u>NORMS</u>

What are "norms"?

Norms are standards for proper and acceptable behavior whether in a large group or just with a partner.

Norms are "rules" for how we choose to interact with one another.



Today, we're going to set some norms as a whole entire class, so that way everyone knows exactly how they should act and also what is not acceptable in this class.

- 4. When someone isn't doing what they should be, or acting in a way they shouldn't, what do you think should happen? What is fair?

NEXT, SHARE YOUR ANSWERS WITH YOUR SMALL GROUP (TAKE TURNS)

- 1. How do you want others to treat you in class?
- 2. What does it look like when everyone is learning together?
- 3. What types of behaviors or actions BOTHER you that you don't want to see anyone doing (or saying)?
- 4. When someone isn't doing what they should be, or acting in a way they shouldn't, what do you think should happen? What is fair?

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NOW, WITH YOUR GROUP, MAKE A LIST OF BEHAVIORS FOR EACH CATEGORY:

- 1. How should everyone treat one another? (list words or phrases)
- 2. What should we all look like when we learn?
- 3. What things should people NOT do in this class (the way they act, what they do, what they say)?
- 4. What should you do (students) when people aren't doing what they're supposed to?
- 5. What should I do (teacher) when students aren't doing what they're supposed to?

- Your group needs to put 1 star next to all the "rules" your group agrees with.
- The ones that get stars will become our class "norms" (or rules).
